Datura Avenue, just south of Anglin's Fishing Pier in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, provides easy access to arguably the best shore diving and snorkeling in the county. The Shipwreck Snorkeling Trail, located on a shallow reef only 500 feet (152 meters) from the beach, includes several cannons, a ship's anchor and a ballast pile. Nearby is an abandoned coral restoration project, known as the biorock. More experienced divers and snorkelers can swim out to the second reef line, located just beyond the pier, about 1,000 feet (305 meters) from the beach. The most experienced divers and snorkelers can reach the line of buoys that mark Anglin's Ledge, approximately three pier-lengths, or 3,000 feet (915 meters), from the beach, which has the most pristine reef and highest biodiversity of the three locations. Be prepared for a surface swim of at least 30 minutes.
